- This thesis analyses and compares the consumer choice paradoxes with two categories of food products: familiar and non-familiar goods. We observe a phenomenon similar to classical preference reversals with unfamiliar goods but this phenomenon is less important in the case of ordinary familiar goods. In the other hand, the gap between willingness to pay and willingness to accept is observed significantly for less familiar products. These results are based on two choice experiments with different food products.
